



Click on the "residents" button, and you should arrive at the login page:



If you don't have a Community Connect account, you'll click on the blue "REGISTER" to make an account When you finish creating your account, you should arrive at your account home page



Click the "Add Permit" button in the burn permits section to get your burn permit; you will be asked to provide some information about what you are burning before the permit is created.

To check whether it is a burn day on the day you wish to burn, look at the "status" of the permit in the burn permit tile. If the status says "Active", burning is allowed that day; if the status says "Suspended - Burn Ban", then burning is not allowed.
